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Fifth Grade

Language Arts

Science

In December 5th graders will continue their investigations above the earth's surface. We will begin by covering the water cycle, just a quick review. Then will will move onto patterns and changes in weather and climate. These are two fun quick units that get us ready to move to the earth's surface after the new year!

Math

5th grade math students are working on fractions in December! This includes adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing fractions. We are also simplifying fractions and converting mixed numbers to improper fractions and vice versa.

Social Studies

Social Studies is almost finished with Government and the Early Years of our country. The next unit, the War of 1812, will begin right after Christmas vacation, but part of that time will be spent participating in Biz Town activities. Sixth Grade

Language Arts

Our 6th grade readers just completed a unit of study on poetry. Our students not only read poetry, but they became poets themselves! Our next genre of study will be persuasive. We will study many different types of persuasive texts, including commercials! Our students will also write a persuasive piece, trying convince their audience to agree with them. We have seen so much growth in our students as writers this semester and we can't wait to see them grow even more!

Science

Sixth grade science students are finishing learning about the importance of simple machines. We are especially focused on the inclined plane and pulley. We will be ending out 2017 year with lots of energy in science as we beginning discussing Energy. We will be looking at the three types of thermal energy and how energy transforms from one form to the next.

Social Studies

The reporters from the TCI Social Studies classes are finishing up their newspaper spreads on South American countries this month! They've been tirelessly researching and gathering information on Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Peru, and Venezuela for this project. Ask them for some fun facts!! We have our District Curriculum Checkpoint coming up mid-month and then we get to travel across the pond to our next destination... Europe!! We will just get to take a glimpse into this historic and enchanting place before our next break. Happy Holidays!!

Math

During the month of December, 6th grade math students will be solving one step equations (and advanced students will solve two-step equations as well). The equations will involve negative and fractional quantities also. They will use terms to properly describe the process that will prepare them for pre-algebra and algebra classes in middle and high school. Terms such as: variable, isolate, balance, inverse, and algebraic solution. This very important process will be the foundation for solving multi-step equations in the future.

Mrs. Roland's and Mrs. Weninger's classes participated in this year's Texans Stats Challenge. Students completed problems each week with statistics from the the previous week's Texans game working on skills like ordering rational numbers, integer operations, percentages and equations. Student also watched weekly videos of members of the Texan's organization explaining how they use math everyday in their job. The Challenge finished with an essay for students to explain what they learned and thought about the challenge. The two best essays from each class where entered into a drawing for tickets to a Texans Game. **Skyler Smith** from Mrs. Roland's class was one of 10 students from the greater Houston area selected. **Way to go, Skyler!!** As a special prize, Skyler and Mrs. Roland were awarded tickets to a Texan's Home Game. Math truly is everywhere!
